Develop your KISS (Kink Inclusive Supervision Services): Supervising clinicians working with kinky clients

Live Online Workshop

Treating kink, BDSM, and other sexually diverse populations requires a more in-depth knowledge of not only supervision styles, but also how working with sexually diverse clients may present differently in the course of their treatment and your supervision with that clinician. When you are supervising a clinician who also identifies as sexually diverse, the supervisor's cultural humility is key to ethical supervision. Finally, if the supervisor and supervisee are both members of the kink community and / or are treating these populations, special care is needed.

TASHRA is excited to announce a 7 CE hour course (APA and AASECT credits available) for supervisors who are supervising clinicians treating sexual minority populations. This course will be held on October 23 - 24th.

This course will cover a broad range of advanced supervision topics for clinicians working with kink populations as well as clinicians who are also members of kink populations.

Learning objectives:

After completion of the webinar, attendees will be able to...

- 1. Assessing goodness of fit between supervisee and supervisor
- Relevant laws and ethics with a focus on multiple relationships (ex. For when a supervisor and / or a supervisee are members of kink populations and treating kink populations)
- 3. Norms for kink-focused supervision
- 4. Supervision strategies & models to consider in kink-focused supervision
- 5. Elements of a kink clinician supervision session
- 6. Empowerment for clinicians working with kink populations
- 7. Action steps of becoming a kink inclusive supervisor

Format:

The workshops will combine didactic instruction, case examples, and group discussion to demonstrate the practice of working with kink-involved clients.

CARAS Complaint Resolution Procedures

CARAS is committed to conducting all activities in compliance with the American Psychological Association's Ethical Principles of Psychologists. CARAS will adhere to all legal and ethical responsibilities to be nondiscriminatory in promotional activities, program content, and the treatment of program participants. Monitoring and assessment of these standards will be the responsibility of the Continuing Education Administrator. While CARAS makes every attempt to assure fair treatment for all participants, occasionally complaints will arise about continuing education programs. The procedures for addressing complaints are as follows:

When a participant files a complaint, either orally or in written format, and expects action on the complaint, the following actions will be taken.

1. If the grievance concerns a speaker, the content presented by the speaker, or the style of presentation, the individual making the complaint will be asked to put his/her

- comments in written format. The on-site CE Coordinator will then pass the comments on to the speaker, assuring the confidentiality of the complainant.
- 2. If the complaint concerns a workshop offering, its content, level of presentation, or the facilities in which the workshop was offered, on-site CE Coordinator will mediate and attempt to resolve the complaint on-site. If the participant requests action, the Coordinator is empowered to:
- a. attempt to move the participant to another workshop, or
- b. provide a credit for a subsequent year's workshop, or
- c. provide a partial or full refund of the workshop fee.
- Actions 2b and 2c will require a written note, documenting the grievance, for record keeping purposes. The note need not be signed by the grieved individual.
- 3. If the complaint is made after the program has occurred or concerns the CARAS CE programming more generally, the CARAS Complaint Panel will address it as follows:
- a. Request that the complainant submit a written complaint and propose an appropriate remedy,
- b. provide the instructor(s) with the opportunity to respond to the complaint and propose an appropriate remedy,
